

Home Learning

Year 4

In these difficult times, we understand that keeping your child entertained and thinking of activities that will help their education may be difficult. Below is a 'pick-and-mix' of ideas and challenges. Using the suggested structure outlined in the 'Home Learning' sections of our website, choose a maths, English and research/topic-based activity to complete each day.

Maths

<p>Use the online lessons that can be found at the White Rose Home Learning Hub:</p> <p>https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-4/</p> <p>Start with the Week 2 lessons, which explore dividing by 10 and 100, hundredths and introduce decimals.</p>	<p>Go on an angle hunt at home!</p> <p>How many right, acute and obtuse angles can you find? Use the number of each type of angle found to create a bar chart showing your results.</p>	<p>Can you draw a picture that is symmetrical?</p> <p>It can be a scene that you can actually see, such as a tree or flower in your garden, or a made up picture. You can add the lines of symmetry if you wish.</p>
<p>Make a list of symmetrical and asymmetrical (not symmetrical) objects that you can find at home.</p> <p>These might be man-made or natural objects. See if you can find 50 or 100 objects in total!</p>	<p>Find some objects with straight sides.</p> <p>Use a ruler or tape measure to measure each side, and then add them up to find the perimeter of each object.</p>	<p>Remember to practise your mental maths!</p> <p>There are lots of different skills that you can practise on https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p>
<p>Practise counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.</p> <p>How far can you go?</p>	<p>Use chalk to create a number line in your garden (ask first!)</p> <p>Can you use it to show negative numbers? Create different number lines, counting in multiples of 6,7,9,25,50 and 1000.</p>	<p>Keep practising telling the time using online games.</p> <p>You can find games by googling 'Splash Learn Time Games': https://www.splashlearn.com/time-games</p>

English

<p>Have you heard about 99 year-old Captain Tom?</p> <p>He has raised many millions of pounds for the NHS by walking around his garden. Write a letter or birthday card thanking him for what he has done. You can even send it to him! His birthday is on 30th April and he will be 100 years old!</p>	<p>Write some interesting sentences describing your Easter weekend. Try and use a fronted adverbial to begin them. For example:</p> <p><i>Before my eyes, was the largest chocolate Easter egg I had ever seen!</i></p> <p>Don't forget your comma after the fronted adverbial!</p>	<p>Keep reading, every day if possible!</p> <p>Find books that you enjoy and read to adults, with adults, to brothers and sisters or even to pets or teddy bears! Make a list of the books that you have read and give them a star rating out of 5.</p>
<p>Practise the words in the Y3/4 spelling list.</p> <p>Can you create some mnemonics to help you learn them? For example, BECAUSE 'big elephants can always understand small elephants'</p>	<p>Use the website:</p> <p>https://spellingframe.co.uk/</p> <p>This website has lots of free games to practise other spelling patterns!</p>	<p>Can you write a list poem about all of the activities that you have been doing at home?</p> <p>For example....</p> <p><i>We had to stay at home to keep safe And we had school at home! And the sun was shining And we cheered for the NHS And I ate lots of chocolate at Easter!</i></p>
<p>Imagine that CBBC Newsround choose YOU to interview about learning at home at this time.</p> <p>Write some questions that they might ask you, then write what your answers would be. You can use this information to create a script for Newsround. Maybe even send it to them!</p>	<p>Can you find out about the festivals that are celebrated by people following different religions?</p> <p>What time of the year do they occur? Are there any happening this Spring time? Share your learning by creating a poster with a different section for each festival or religion..</p>	<p>We hope you are enjoying reading "Charlotte's Web."</p> <p>Find out about farm animals, both in the UK and in the USA where the story is set. You could present your research as a fact-file or poster! You could even draw some of these animals, using your sketching skills.</p>
